After she climbed a few rungs on the corporate ladder, Joanne rebalanced her life to spend more time at home with her daughters. Consulting gigs allowed her to employ her thinking skills on something besides the kids' activity schedules. Joanne also had the chance to try on a variety of occupational hats, including writer, editor, brand strategist, and personal historian.

As her daughters started to fly the coop, Joanne recalled what it was like to be in their shoes, teetering on the brink of adulthood. She thought about how getting her first job, getting married, having her first baby, and other experiences were trickier to navigate than she expected. To help her daughters be better prepared, Joanne wrote *Things Your Mother Should Have Told You*, an unfiltered and often funny account of what assembling her grown-up life really looked like.

Things Your Mother Should Have Told You features tales about troublesome situations like picking the wrong major and having to fire a bridesmaid. It covers tricky subjects like assessing whether he's "The Guy" and figuring out whether you're ready to have a baby. It attempts to answer how-the-hell-is-this-going-to-work questions like whether it really is possible to juggle a career and motherhood like conventional wisdom says you can. Most importantly, it delivers the message that everything usually works out okay.
